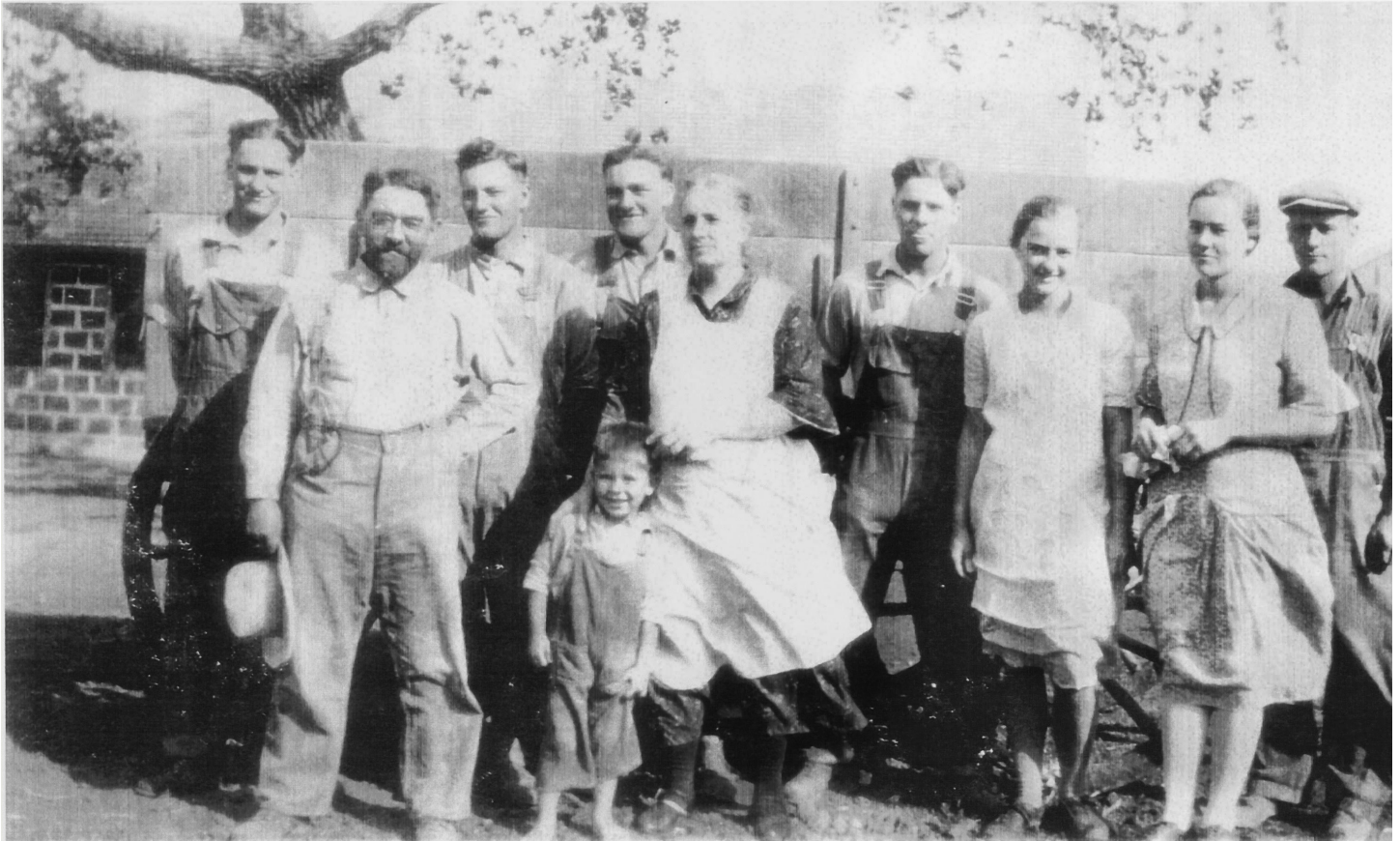

North Butler 4-H Club December Meeting

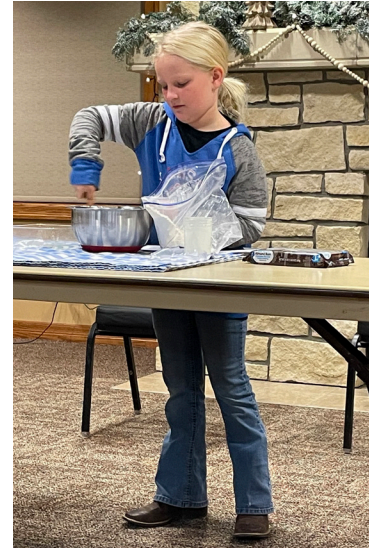
