





tems must be brought to the street for curbside pickup. Waste Connections requests all items to be collected be set at the curb PRIOR TO 7:00AM, March 23rd.

WASTE CONNECTIONS WILL MAKE ONE PASS THROUGH THE CITY

Waste Connections asks that all items being collected need to be able to be handled by one person safely and be on the APPROVED ITEMS LIST.

Approved Items

General trash, small amounts of bundled brush or limbs, Furniture including: chairs, couches, tables. Appliances including: washers, dryers, dishwashers, microwaves, small electrical appliances such as TV's, computers, mixers, blenders. Patio grills, patio furniture, push lawn mowers (free of gas & oil) and lawn trimmers. Tree limbs and branches must be cut in 3ft. lengths and bundled for easy pickup. Any trash not in the trash cart must be in throwaway containers such as boxes or bags, no more than 30-gallon capacity.

Not Approved Items

No loose trash or debris or no box or bag may exceed 40 pounds in weight. No rock, dirt or concrete. Car batteries, oil filters, fluorescent light bulbs, propane tanks, any asbestos materials, explosives, paint

(we will take empty & dried up paint cans), no hazardous liquids (such as fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, solvents, diesel fuel, gas, oil, transmission fluid, antifreeze, etc...) tires. REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS AND AIR CONDITIONS must be tagged by a technician and must have the appropriate paper work with it in order for Waste Connections to pick it up.



WHITEWATERS CHICKEN CODE

Did you know that Whitewater has a Code for that? If you have or want to have chickens at your residence you must first apply to do so. A new Chicken Permit Application can be found online or in the office. Upon submitting your application either a permit will be issued to be posted on the outside of your coop or your application will be denied until certain criteria is met. Each year you will be contacted by the city to check in on your chickens and also remind you to pay the chicken fee for that years permit. A few 2024 permits have already been issued, so if you have chickens but no permit please contact the city clerk ASAP or go online and find the application.



City Code: Chapter II. Article 1. Section 109A

a.) It shall be unlawful for any person to keep or harbor for any purpose chickens except under the conditions set forth below.

b.) Up to 6 laying hens may be kept on any one residential lot or tract (this restriction applies even though a residence may include more than one lot) by permit only.

c.) A \$20 annual permit fees shall be charged for each residential lot or tract owner. A permit form shall be obtain from the city clerk before a permit is issued. The Animal Control Officer/Code Officer shall inspect the appropriateness of the coops and compliance with other requirements set forth herein.

d.) Roosters are not permitted. Laying hens only are allowed.

e.) Chicken coops are required and structures housing chickens must be located at least 50 feet away from any structure that includes a dwelling unit on an adjacent lot.

*f.) It shall be unlawful for any person to allow chickens owned by or under the control of such person to run at large within the city. Chickens shall be confined within a secure, outdoor, enclosed area such as a four foot fence. The enclosure area shall include a chicken coop.

* Please drawup a plan/map showing what you have in place or will have in place and submit those plans at the time of your permit application.

Whitewater River Consolidated Fire District



The Whitewater River CFD responded to 19 calls for service in the month of February. They included three grass fires, seven medical calls, a citizen assist, a false alarm, two structure fires, three motor vehicle accidents, a trash fire and a false alarm. Eight of these calls were automatic aid calls to other fire departments. We received automatic aid from Peabody and Potwin on two of our calls.

One of the calls involved one of our volunteer firefighters assisting with CPR on a patient in cardiac arrest. After about thirty minutes from receiving the first page, the patient was re-triaged to critical condition (Heart was beating) and transported to an area hospital. The patient is now out of the hospital now and going about their daily routine.

About a week later, two of our volunteer firefighters responded to another cardiac arrest call and assisted with chest compressions and other patient care. The AED was used to deliver one shock prior to EMS arriving. EMS and first responders worked diligently on the patient for over forty-five minutes but unfortunately, the outcome was drastically different from the other call.

The Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) used during the above incidents was purchased in 2023. The volunteer firefighters elected to purchase the new AED with donations to the department that were received from memorials and other donations. During the first call, the patient was apparently never had a shockable rhythm so the AED never delivered a shock. On the second call, the AED read a shockable rhythm and we were able to deliver a shock prior to EMS arriving on scene. This particular AED was purchased to replace one of our two old AEDs. With the new AED, the pads can be unhooked from our AED and plugged directly into both Butler County EMS and Newton EMS's monitor which saves time from having to remove and replace the pads while performing CPR.

At the scene of a cardiac arrest event, it is not unusual for there to be eight to ten responders working on the patient at one point or another. It takes a lot of people/manpower to perform CPR for thirty to forty-five minutes. One person can perform chest compressions for just a few minutes straight before that person cannot give adequate compressions, which is why we are taught the pit crew technique. This is where one person normally gives chest compressions for about two minutes and then switches with another person.

Last month we had two drills. At the first drill, the volunteer firefighters went to different addresses and gave a scene size up over the radio, did patient assessments and worked on pumping the different trucks. The second drill, Stuart Funk with Butler County EMS came out to train our volunteers on Stop-The-Bleed.
