RNR/Budget Hearing & Council Meeting Highlights from 8/26/24

- RESOLUTION 0826-24 to exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate of 53.304 mills was adopted with a 4-1 vote.
- The 2025 Budget was adopted with a 4-1 vote.
- Residents in attendance would like a clearer picture of where money is being spent and would like to see it being used to help ALL of Whitewater.
- A cost analysis and needs assessment of the Scout House will begin to gain a clear picture of what can be done to keep the rent low but also maintain and bring in some needed updates or improvements.
- Parks & Rec has appointed Elizabeth Herbel to the Parks Board for a two-year term. Basketball signups will happen in about a month.
- The City Clerk has begun the process to digitize and update the Whitewater City Codes (Ordinances) by gathering all documents to share with *Ranson CityCode* and the new City Attorney.
- The burnout (chlorine) from El Dorado is in full swing and has been noticed by many residents. It should be completed by the end of September.
- City Maintenance has been working on locating and assessing the functionality of all the water valves around town. There are about 190 valves in Whitewater and many need some work or “exercising” to bring them back to a better functioning status. Cost estimates for the Valve Project will be presented at the next meeting.
- The Lagoons were inspected by KDHE and it was recommended that the city make some modifications on how things have been done and what the city needs to plan for as Whitewater grows.
- The Fire Department assisted City Maintenance in checking the Fire Hydrants all around town. A list of most problematic to minor issues was provided for the upcoming Fire Hydrant Repair Project.
- The water tower services which were contracted in 2019 with Viking will be looked over at next months meeting and Viking should complete services previously postponed.

All are welcome at City Council meetings.

Public Comment time is available, with a 5 minute limit per person.

To discuss a specific topic, please contact the City Clerk to be placed on the agenda.
